## COVID-19: TRAVELLER INFORMATION

On Sunday, 15 March 2020, President Cyril Ramaphosa announced a travel ban in order to reduce the impact of the Coronavirus Disease.

The travel ban includes the following countries:



Effective 18 March the ban entails the cancellation of visas granted to citizens from high-risk destinations and any foreigners who have visited high-risk countries will be denied a visa.

All Cape Town's main attractions are closed during this time.

## WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR A TRAVELLER?

If you are visiting South Africa:

Restrict your isolation to one location.

Communicate with your tour-operator to extend your stay in order to self-isolate for 14 days.

If you are in Cape Town when the travel ban is implemented check with your agent and/or airline's operational limitations.



**Postpone** or cancel international travel (all areas).



Maintain **social distancing**: limiting public gatherings as much as possible.



**Avoid** all non-essential domestic travel.



If showing **symptoms** whilst travelling, notify airline or ground staff immediately.



Self-isolate at home for **14 days**, after travelling.
